Incorporated in March 2020, cious do GRI rescued 321 cats/kittens in the Northern Neck last year, said Haurand. Of those felines, 208 were adopted into their "fur-ever" homes. So far in 2021, GRI has rescued 34 additional cats and 77 have

gone to loving homes.

Currently there are 65 cats/kittens in foster homes, she said.

"It takes a lot of money to be able to care for these animals," said Haurand. "On average, GRI spends \$2,146 per month on cat food and supplies and over \$4,200 per month on vet bills."

GRI gets no local, state or federal funding, she said. All funds are received from gracious donors, grants and all important fundraisers.
