GARFIELD'S RESCUE NEEDS YOUR HELP

Garfield's needs your help in getting the word out about our Spring Fundraiser Event. Incorporated March 2020, we rescued 321 cats/kittens on the Northern Neck last year. Of those felines, 208 of them were adopted into their furrever homes. So far in 2021, we have rescued 34 additional cats and 77 have gone to loving homes. We currently have 65 of our rescues in foster homes.

It takes a lot of money to be able to care for these animals. On average GRI spends \$2,146 per month on cat food and supplies and over \$4,200 per month on vet bills. We get no local, state or federal funding. All of our funds are received from our gracious donors, grants and our all important fundraisers.
