Garfield's Rescue Inc. (GRI) held our first general membership meeting on Monday, February 22, 2021 via email. We are pleased to announce that the amended bylaws passed unanimously along with the election of three new At Large Board of Director Members, Ginger Landry, Louise Mohardt, and Karen Peterson.

In 2020 GRI rescued/fostered 321 kittens/cats that were friendly strays or owner surrenders. We are pleased that 209 of those kitten/cats went to their furever homes. At the end of February another 77 cats have been adopted. Your support and donations are key to our success. Welcome Spring and Kitten Season

Last spring a kind citizen reported finding a



newborn kitten to Garfield's Rescue Inc. (GRI). The kitten, named Apollo, required bottle feeding every 3 hours. Later Apollo's mother and siblings were located and reunited with Apollo in foster care, and all was

well. The best news is that Apollo's family were all adopted.

If you find a kitten(s), please do not pick them up. Observe the kitten(s) from a distance. According to Alley Cat Allies, "Separating kittens younger than ~8 weeks old from their mother is harmful to their wellbeing. Kittens need their mother as she is their best possible caregiver." The kittens may seem abandoned; however, the mother cat may not be far away hunting, hiding, or waiting for you to move away from her babies.

If the kittens are sleeping and seem content, then the mother is probably nearby. Check on the kittens every few hours. When you



check the area again and there are fewer kittens, the mother is most likely moving them to a new area. If you are not sure, sprinkle flour around where the kittens are located and look for paw prints in the disturbed flour when you revisit the site. The only time you would want to move the kittens is if they are in obvious danger.

If you determine that the mother is present,



continue to observe the family from a distance, she will most likely move the kittens to a new area. It is best for the mother cat to nurse the kittens for a greater chance of survival.

Around six to eight weeks the kittens should be socialized

by humans. When the kittens have reached that age, contact GRI at 804-480-2066 or by email at garfieldsrescue@gmail.com. GRI will foster the mother cat and kittens and prepare them for adoption into their furever home. Please call Garfield's before contacting your local animal shelter. GRI works closely with all Northern Neck animal shelters during kitten season. The animal shelters will contact Garfield's to take un-weaned and very young kittens they have in custody. Let Garfield's know if you have reported found kittens to an animal shelter.

Zur

Making a difference, one cat at a time. Every day volunteers of Garfield's Rescue, Inc. (GRI) see what a difference we make in the lives of homeless cats. Zur is one example of GRI not only making a difference, but saving his life.



Zur was surrendered to one of the Northern Neck's county animal shelters on 12/31/2020. Zur was thin and lethargic. He drank lots of water and his coat was unkept. Shelter caregivers took him to a veterinarian who found that Zur was diabetic and needed insulin

injections. The shelter was unable to provide the care required by a special needs cat. Reluctantly the decision was made to euthanize Zur on 1/5/2021. A shelter volunteer, who is also a Garfield's Rescue member, reached out to GRI with information about Zur. GRI's Director of Fosters immediately said, "we'll take him!"

After three months on insulin and routine testing to adjust his dose, Zur has gained four pounds, has a thick healthy coat, and enjoys interacting with his foster siblings and GRI

volunteers. At 7 years old, Zur will a wonderful addition to a family who is comfortable tending to his diabetic needs. the Fortunately,



insulin and syringes are not expensive. Zur accepts his twice daily injections without complaint and leans into the hand of anyone offering to pat him.

Zur has been featured on CBS Richmond's Channel 6 "Paws for Pets" program that promotes cat and dog adoptions. Zur's segment may be viewed on their wtvr.com website.

Rescuing Zur did not change the world, but it did change the world for Zur.
