The article also references the planned kidnapping of Michigan Governor Gretcher Whitmer several months ago where it was discovered that F.B.I. operatives were instr mental in encouraging, planning and facilitating the plot. As reported:

"The FBI special agent that oversaw the Whitmer kidnapping operation was transferred to the FBI's District of Columbia office last year, where he is overseeing the Jan. 6 investigations.

As part of its anti-terrorism efforts, especially after the 9/11 attacks, the FBI has be known to target individuals in sting operations where its operatives played key roles. Critics have argued that without the FBI's involvement, there would never have been a plot to investigate in the first place.

FBI informants and undercover agents can be authorized to conduct some illegal activities as part of their assignments, according to Ruskin.

A Senate investigation into the Capitol intrusion concluded that a number of failure in the intelligence apparatus caused the Capitol Police to be unprepared for what took place. Given the numerous warnings and assurances of preparedness made before the eve how could this have happened?"

In a June 28th article by Julie Kelly in American Greatness it is described how som members of law enforcement attacked peaceful protestors with tear gas, pepper spra rubber bullets, batons and even fists. As described by Kelly:

"Video obtained by American Greatness last month shows Capitol police throwing flashbangs into a crowd of protesters outside the building. The device, also known as stun grenade, emits flashes of light and a sound louder than a jet engine. It can cause temporary blindness and disorientation; some flashbangs contain rubber pellets, which some protesters claim were the ones used by police on January 6.

"They've been throwing flashbangs, shooting us with bullets," Kash Kelly said on the CONTINUED ON PAGE 29
