

# GRI to hold adoption event, bake sale Dec. 14

Garfield's Rescue Inc. (GRI) has over 100 fosters in custody. This high number of fosters is due to a continuous wave of kitten season and an influx of re-homed cats from senior citizens who can no longer care for their beloved pets, reported vice president Ann Bedford.

GRI receives no funding from any local, state or federal agencies relying solely on donations, grants and fundraisers to meet its average monthly costs of \$12,900 to house, feed and provide medical care for their homeless fosters. GRI will hold a bake sale

and adoption event from 11 a.m.-3 p.m. December 14, at the Hayden Building, Dream Fields, 1385 Irvington Road, Weems.

"All are invited to purchase baked goods in support of a great cause and spend some time with kittens and adult cats," said Bedford. "You may just find your new and loving best friend."
